Included are three days of skiing, two breakfasts, Saturday night banquet with door prizes, and up to 16 hours of ski instructions in downhill, telemark, snowboarding and cross country techniques, along with two nights lodging.

Lodging consists of two choices: Schuss Village or Cedar River. Schuss Village is the typical two queen beds, one bath for \$339 per person, double occupancy. Quad accommodations are \$295 per person.

Cedar River is a small suite, 2 queen beds, one bath, sleeper sofa with a small living room at \$433, double occupancy; only \$333 per person as a quad.

If someone is interested in spending a couple days exploring Vancouver prior to the cruise, we have reservations at the Days Inn at the Vancouver Airport. The price will be \$80 per person per night double occupancy. If you want to stay four to a room, the cost will be \$40 per night each. Additional details on accommodations for the optional stay in Vancouver and air flights will be communicated to all participants. If you want to go on the cruise but don't know what may happen in your life between now and May 2016, you will get all your money back minus a \$30 cancellation fee as long as you cancel by January 19, 2016.
