SALMON FISHING, AUGUST 24

August is prime fishing time on beautiful Lake Michigan. The fish are schooling and getting ready to go up the Grand River at Grand Haven. Dave Panetta has reserved three boats, six people per boat. Sign up by August 19 to reserve your spot. The trip is six hours, starting at 6:00 am and ends at noon. There are many species to catch: Chinook salmon, Steelhead, Coho salmon, Brown Trout, Lake Trout. Each boat will have 12 to 18 lines out and we will take turns catching fish. Bring a cooler for your fish, which will be cleaned and filleted for you by the boat crew. You will need a valid fishing license. An all-species 24-hour license can be bought for \$10 at the dock. You may bring food and beverages, but NO glass containers. The temperature can be 10 to 15 degrees cooler on the lake, so bring a jacket and if rain is predicted, rain gear. Wear soft soled shoes, if possible, and your camera. The cost is \$110 per person. There is always a small chance the trip will be cancelled due to extreme weather but you will get a full refund if that happens. 


