## How to Run a Successful Outing!

### SELLING YOUR TRIP!

Your trip has been approved by Council. You are eager for the next General Meeting so you can share the good news with the club.

Before you can sell your trip to the members and guests, be sure you have the following items.

**Flyers:** to distribute and also to post on the web site and Facebook page detailing your trip.

**Notes:** for your presentation.

**An article for the newsletter:** every media outlet (Facebook, Yahoo blast, web site) should be utilized.

When the meeting moderator announces your trip, this is the time to stand up and give your pitch. It is very important to show enthusiasm and be positive about the trip. This will get more people to sign up than any other factor.

As people sign up for the trip they will either give you the whole amount or a deposit. Record these figures on the Activity Deposits Form (ADF). This "no carbon paper" form is avail-

able from the treasurer. At the end of the evening turn in the ADF form to the treasurer, along with any money collected. Checks should be made out to the "Jug & Mug Ski Club". The ADF form will assist you when you deliver your final report. Some members may be interested but not ready to pay. You can place these individuals on a waiting list.

Compile a list of names and contact information on the contact and waiver form (available on the web site) to disseminate information about the trip.

There will always be participants that will be slow to pay after their deposit. If members do not pay in full before the due date, it will be necessary to contact people on your waiting list.

Your job is to sell the trip. Wherever, whenever the club has a function, be ready with your event material to sell your trip.

Good luck with your trip. The more the merrier, whether it is a trip for four, forty or four hundred, the idea is to get together and have fun with the Jug & Mug Club.
