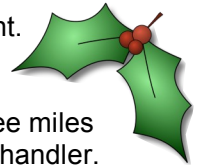
CHRISTMAS PARTY, DECEMBER 10

Council Column

Dear Fellow Club Members:

As I look back at what has been offered, this has been a year of wonderful club events. Some events we might call traditional (yes, we have been around long enough to call them traditional); the Halloween party, weekly TGIFs, monthly parties at someone's home, theater in Chelsea and, of course, the ski trips. Some events were new. We added a cruise to Alaska, a wine tasting, Painting with a Twist, several sport events with the Lugnuts, the Griffins, and the Tigers. There are too many to include all. It was a good year with something for everyone.

The council wants you to participate in two possible changes to the club. Both of these changes are an attempt to make the club more relevant and to continue its growth. The last two newsletters presented opinions and reasons to allow or not allow members who get married to remain active in the club. The second change, which I feel strongly about and have even before becoming a member, is a name change.

First, this is how we are officially approaching a possible name change.

- A committee made up of council and non-council members currently is running a competition for new names. They will choose three. We will vote on those three, plus the original name.
- If one of the new names is selected, we will again vote to make this a change in the constitution.

Change can be positive, welcome, or for some, hard to accept. We have a long history as the Jug & Mug Ski Club. However, as the number of members becomes fewer, there are fewer events and often the same few people are responsible for what we do.

The Jug & Mug Ski Club may have been the perfect name for the 60's. It was the perfect time for ski clubs. There were weekly trips as well as overseas trips. That was the focus. Now we are a four seasons club that includes many activities as well as skiing. It is not our club alone that is feeling the difference. The ones that survive have to move into a new era. The words "jug" and "mug" have a new meaning now. To most who are not familiar with the original meaning, which is most of us, it is not representative of who we are. I did not attend or join for many years, although I was looking for something new in my life, because the name indicated something I wasn't interested in joining. One member persisted and got me to a general meeting. What I discovered was a welcoming group of people who had a wide variety of interests.

Recently, some 30 to 40 year olds have questioned why I would belong to such a club solely because of the name. I have had a few new members say they are uncomfortable with the name and were hesitant to even visit. Like my experience, once they saw what it would add to their life, they stayed. In my opinion, it is time to rename the club. If we want to recruit new members, we should represent what we are: a club with tradition and one that has changed with the times. This club has a great history and hopefully will have a great future if we can make that change.

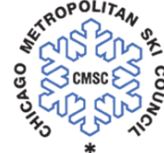
