Council Column

"The Times They Are A Changin" - Bob Dylan, 1964

One of the reasons people join the Jug & Mug Ski Club is for the social gatherings, to meet other folks and socialize, such as going to dinner and a movie, or attending a baseball game, or playing cards.

It's the reason I joined the club. Like many others, I went through the online dating sites, only to come away disappointed and jaded. I was looking to socialize with others my age. Sure, I could meet people in bars and gyms, but I rarely saw the same people twice and didn't forge relationships that way. This club appealed to me because it offered a variety of events that I could choose from.

Although the name is the Jug & Mug SKI Club, because it was founded as a ski club, today it's more than a ski club. Most of the current members do *not* ski, but there are a few ski trips and events for those who want to ski with friends and benefit from a group rate. At one time, I was a skier. I've thought about going back to skiing, but my logic prevails when I think that one bad fall could really wipe me out!

If it were just a ski club, I would not be a member. And that brings up a situation the club today is addressing: the club's name. Our name should reflect who we are and what we do. The club's name has a much different connotation than it did in the 1960s when the club was formed and the name referred to a jug of wine and a mug of beer. Today the name refers to boobs and beer. Not a message to attract new members. More and more, when I go to our weekly happy hour group, it's embarrassing to ask, and often elicits a wry smile, where is the Jug and Mug group seated. More and more, I refer to our club as the J&M club.

Change is good and necessary to keep anything viable, including a decades-old club. The club needs to get current. We are a social club, not a drinking and sex group. The name needs changing. As a men's council member, I encourage club members to vote on this important issue.

The council is continually looking to attract new members and grow our membership. A name change might help. Another thing we could do is look at what benefits we have for joining. Incentives, such as a \$100 if a member signs on for a ski trip, or \$50 spending money if the person goes on the Mackinac Island trip, could be a first step in making many of our events available to those members with limited budgets. We can't force people to do activities, but financial incentives might help put more names on the event rosters.

These changes are within the scope of what we can do to update our club, to renew it's purpose and to keep it a fun social club for Lansing singles. Who knows, we could keep the club going for 50 more years!
