It appears winter is upon us and with that being said, several activities are going on in the club. As I look back, 2016 has been another good year for me. I did some traveling and activities with the club.

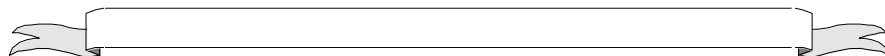

As far as the club names goes, I have no issues with it. It's the people in the club that make it the fun group it is.

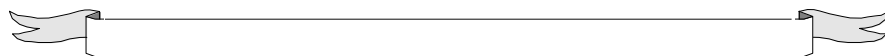

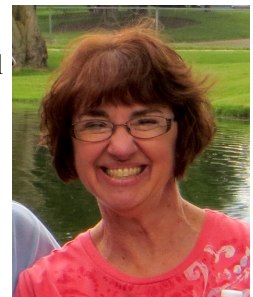
We had great conversations and good food at Coral Gables after our singing. Again, we thank everyone who made this event a success.

Written notice of the "Keep Marrieds" Amendment to the Jug and Mug Constitution

In the "Council Column" of previous newsletters this year, you have read arguments for (Dorothy Harney in November) and against (Rich Rybicki in October) changing the Jug and Mug "singles only" rule to a policy which would allow members who get married to stay members (as long as their spouse joined) and would allow previous married members to rejoin (as long as their spouse joined).

Below is the language of the Amendment, which has been approved by Council for a General Membership vote.

You will see ballots for this amendment in your February, March, and April newsletters; you may turn in your ballot at the February, March, or April General Meetings, or mail it in to the Jug and Mug Post Office box.

"Keep Marrieds" Amendment to ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP

Section 1 A currently defines ACTIVE MEMBERS as "those persons who have paid their dues for the current fiscal year, have passed their 21st birthday and are single according to statutory law.

Our committee wishes to

-Modify the definition of Active Members in Section 1 A to read

ACTIVE MEMBERS: Shall be those persons who

Have paid their dues for the current year,

Have passed their 21st birthday, and

Are single according to statutory law

OR

Are previous members who are currently married

-Add Section 1 F

RETURNING MEMBERS: must pay their dues for the current fiscal year, and, if married, both spouses must both join at the same time.

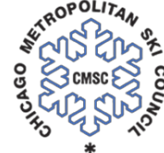
