GREAT LAKES SAIL, AUGUST 28-31 Live

on a 77 foot sailing schooner, hoist the sails, take a turn at the wheel, and learn about your great Lake Michigan. We will leave Northport at 1:00 pm on Monday and set sail! The best trip will happen when we take advantage of the weather and where we go will depend on the winds, weather, and you. Our captain will give us options based on the conditions and we can decide together what adventures are within reach. Maybe a sail around Old Mission Peninsula, arguably the most beautiful coastline in Michigan. We could sail to Power Island in Grand Traverse Bay and walk the shoreline. We could sail over the Leelanau Peninsula to Cathead Bay. If the weather and the winds are in our favor, we could chose to sail to islands in the Great Lakes Archipelago: Beaver Island, High Island, Garden Island, and Hog Island. Closer are the Manitou Islands, or South Fox Island, which has a historic lighthouse and is said to have the most beautiful beach in the Midwest.

The destination is not the journey, however. There will be multiple opportunities to learn about ships, sailing, and the Great Lakes. With our own scientist and educator on board, we can learn more about Lake Michigan. The Inland Seas Schooner is an educational vessel with sampling equipment, a laboratory, and a professional camera-equipped underwater vehicle. If we are lucky, we will be able to explore a shipwreck with the camera on the vehicle and watch it on the monitor. As always, the maritime traditions of card games, music and storytelling are observed.

This is more of a camping adventure than a cruise ship experience; we will be sleeping in berths. You must be able to climb up and down a ladder and step over a small gap. You may be asked to help with the lines for the sails and the anchor. All meals on the ship will be provided. Due to safety concerns, no alcohol will be allowed on board.

There are only ten berths available. If we fill up, the cost will be \$425 each. If the trip does not fill up, we will have to pay a bit more each. A non-refundable deposit of \$25 is required. No refunds after July 19 but a cancellation list will be maintained.
